Thank you for your email of 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2018, in which you requested the following information:

I'm writing to enquiry if the land formerly owned by BRB Residuary Limited to the North of the train station in Rye, East Sussex is currently owned by National Rail. I have the title and plan provided by HM Land Registry, and can see that the western most piece of the land has been sold however the existing title remains in the name of the BRBR Limited. The land title number is : ESX284659

I have processed your request under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

I can confirm that we hold the information you requested.

I have attached for your information a copy of the Land Ownership Plan which highlights in Green the land owned by Network Rail in relation to the location you have specified.

The land shown edged orange was transferred from Railtrack predecessors in title to Network Rail to BRB Residuary Ltd in 1994 (DA0326RT). It would appear from the HM Land Registry that the land was subsequently divided into two parcels of land and sold/registered under Title numbers ESX330791 and ESX28465.
